

Onlookers

Ashutosh Bhardwaj

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Onlookers presents artworks which explore the relationship between mass media and the organization of collective thought.

The artist implies that while our experience of the world is virtually amplified with an overflow of information through various forms of media, our perceptions are mediated by the way in which the information is represented.

Since the process of communication invariably involves a selective framing of experience, all representations perpetuate their own versions of reality. Further generalizations lead to the creation of stereotypes and clichés. Assuming that reality itself is a faceted and shifting trope, the birth of stereotypes and clichés may reduce its experience into monolithic truisms. However, clichés reveal how a general view or consensus is reached.

The artist engages with the cliché as a means of comprehending the organization of collective thought. The title 'Onlookers' attempts to ponder the passivity that is associated with subject-hood, to address the self as a discerning subject.

Within this context, the work titled Cannibals is a subversive representation of the subject-object relationship. A sculptural self-portrait of the artist in various stances as a subject is placed inside the T.V. frame. Through a simple inversion, the subject now becomes the object, thereby making the work introspective. The arrangement of the elements is set up as a silent tableau staging a mock yet ominous picture of the plight of the subject.


Fear Me (Not) attempts a playful imaging and conception of fictitious idols. Large-sized ricket balls sculpted and cast out of fiberglass have been anthropomorphized. By dressing these balls with various other objects and images the semblance of a head is created. These are balanced on tall pedestals made to look like donation boxes. Each of these 'idols' appears to be representative of a social convention or stereotyping. The work attempts a sardonic comment on the creation of clichés.




